Monthly Print Competitions

This season's competition is now completed and congratulations go to Julia Wainwright winner of the Open Print trophy and to Alan Colegrave for winning the People and Portrait trophy.

July Reminders:

26th - AGM

Panel of Small Prints Competition (The John King Trophy) explained. It began as a film based competition where the images were only returned to the photographer as twelve enprints on the competition evening. Using scissors, boards, tape and 'props', the resulting montages were then judged. Now we're in the digital age, please bear this history in mind and continue the spirit of the event. Each member may enter up to 2 panels. Panels are on mount boards of 50x40cm, and comprise any number of small images/prints, each no bigger than 7x5 inches.

For clarification, the images/prints may be spaced out, or may touch, or may overlap, but they must be obviously distinct and there must be no repetition. It is quite usual to assemble all the images together and print them on a single sheet of paper. An overall background, and any additional materials, may be included within the overall display. Anything more than the 7x5 inch size limit must not be photographic.

3d May: Annual Set Subject Competitions, judged by Ron Tear

19th May: Guildhall Battle @ Wycombe PS

Eight clubs participated in this year's Guildhall Battle, Wycombe Photographic Scoiety's annual inter-club print competition, comprising six prints per club. The competition was judged by Julia Cleaver and congratulations go to Wycombe for winning the trophy. Maidenhead were second and we came third. This was the last outing for Julia Wainwright's "Suslik on Guard" and Avril Candler's "Trunk Call" prints, both of which scored 20 – a happy ending!

24th May: Annual Landscape Print & Projected Competition

This year's competition was judged by Colin Southgate FRPS DPAGB.

The **Print** trophy went to Dave Martin for "Evening Shadows" (Straith's Harbour second); Julia Wainwright's "Vestrahorn Reflection" was third. Highly commended were Avril Candler's "Woodland Impression", John Draper's "A Walk in the Mist" and Alan Colegrage's "Skutustahahrepur" (easy for him to say!).

The **Projected** trophy went to Alan Colegrave for "Evening Light, Ladakh" with John Draper taking second and third place with "Light and Shade" and "Stormy Weather". Highly commended were Celia Clover's "Early Morning – Richmond Park", Ron Churchill'Is "England" and Avril's "Shadowland".

Special thanks to Colin for his sympathetic and helpful commentary across both competitions.

31st May: Practical Session with Stuart Robinson FRPS

Stuart's master class was a great success. He began the evening with examples of flash photography from sporting moments explaining how the use of fill-in flash enhances portraits and action shots without the need for expensive/complicated lighting equipment. Braving the 'winter' weather, Stuart led a practical session (almost undaunted by the cold!) reinforcing how professional techniques, know-how and affordable flash equipment can be applied to our own photography. Back in the warmth of the club for the final session to see some of the results of the practical which demonstrated the effects of different exposures, panning etc. before a canter through Stuart's press photographs reinforcing the top tips. So, grateful thanks to Stuart for an educational and entertaining evening and to everyone who braved the weather!

7th June - Ron Wake Trophy Round 1

Roger Reynolds FRPS was our judge for this first round of our inter-club print competition comprising seven clubs (Ealing HH, Field End, Northolt, Pinner, Watford, XRR and Harrow) each of whom submitted seven prints from seven authors. Roger gave an excellent commentary for each of the 49 prints giving us all an informative and thoroughly enjoyable evening.
