And to Julia Wainwright and John Draper for each having a print accepted amongst those selected to represent the Chilterns in the forthcoming PAGB Inter-Federation Print Competition.

The Inter-Federation Competition is held each June. Federations submit entries from the members of their affiliated Clubs in four Categories – Monochrome Prints, Colour Prints, Open Projected and Nature Projected. Trophies are awarded to the winning Federations. PAGB medals and ribbons are awarded to individual images in each Category. We have our fingers crossed!

To celebrate Harrow Women's Centre's 25th anniversary, they are organising a photography competition entitled "A woman's place is ... everywhere: women's lives in 2017". HWC were inspired by Anita Corbin's "First Women" project, and she has agreed to be their keynote speaker on 30<sup>th</sup> June when the competition is launched.

HCC has been invited to join the judging panel and Avril Candler has agreed to represent us. The competition closes in September; the judges will select 25 photographs which they consider to be the most original and appealing. Those 25 images will then be displayed online, and at locations in Harrow; people will be invited to vote. Prizes will be awarded to the 3 photographs which get the most votes. It is an exciting venture for the Women's Centre and we anticipate it will get good media coverage.
