The Allure of the Photography Magazine

I expect we have all from time to time spent the odd fiver, or less, on a photography magazine. There are plenty to choose from and here is an image of the relevant shelf of a national retailer to demonstrate their continuing allure.



But what are they good for? I once regularly bought *Amateur Photographer* It's not bad. With regular lists of specifications and prices of cameras and lenses, together with updates on the latest (and, once in a while, old) kit it hit a sweet spot for a while. Some of the software articles were also good and even if dominated by Adobe programmes such as Photoshop, alerted you to what might be available in your own. There is a regular look at how clubs are run (Harrow once featured) though these are a bit formulaic. This, coupled with some stunning images and a critique at the end of an interesting photograph made the magazine a good investment at the time.

Now, however, I hardly ever buy a copy and generally regret having done so when I do. The price has risen but, more importantly, there comes a point where an amateur photographer knows most of what's being written about and anyway has at their fingertips (through the internet) an array of resources that can answer very specific questions you may have, or thousands of images for you to explore. (Personally I have wasted the lifetimes of several small rodents looking at cameras and lenses on ebay or MPB and then seeing how they perform on Flickr – that's a habit you do not want to get started on!)

Many of the other magazines are camera or software specific and I guess some might find this more targeted approach useful. I recently bought a copy of *Black and White Photography Magazine*. I've just looked up the subscription which, at £26.40 for six issues, seems good value if that's an area of interest to you. However, I can't help feeling that after a fairly short while you will have got everything you need to from it.
